TRACK THE STATE OF STUDENT VOTING RIGHTS

MASSACHUSETTS



SB 389 allows 17-year-olds to vote in primaries if they will be 18 by the corresponding election.

17-year-olds have the ability to participate in the entire electoral process when they will be 18 by the general election.

NEW YORK



AB 5992 implements automatic voter registration for students graduating from a NY high school and implements automatic voter registration at the DMV.

All eligible students graduating from a NY high school would be registered to vote unless they decline registration.

OREGON



HB 2948 and SB 802 allows for preregistration at 16 years old.

Preregistration engages younger people in the democratic process.

TFXAS



HB 2202 adds photo IDs from Texas public colleges and universities to the list of acceptable voter IDs.

This lifts the burden of proof of identity for students who are out-of-state or don't have a driver's license.

NEW HAMPSHIRE



SB 3 is an attack which will effect many voters in the state, including students. The bill presumes that new residents are not eligible to vote in the state unless they perform an act to prove their intent to remain in NH. The bill also requires renters to get a written statement from their landlord if they are not on a lease, effectively giving landlords veto power over a citizen's ability to vote.
