



Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Arkansas

Voter Registration Deadline
30 days before Election Day

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Arkansas does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Arkansas does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

Compensation Restrictions: Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: The state mail-in voter registration application can be downloaded from the [Secretary of State's website](#).

Federal Form: The [federal mail-in voter registration application](#) may be used in voter registration drives.

Photocopying Blank Forms: You can photocopy blank forms for voter registration drives.

Handling Applications

Incomplete Applications: There is no law or administrative rule prohibiting a voter registration drive volunteer or organizer from filling in missing information. FELN does not recommend making any changes to an application or filling in missing information without the express consent of the applicant.

Photocopying Completed Applications: There is no law or rule prohibiting organizations conducting voter registration drives from photocopying or retaining information from completed registration applications.

Submitting Completed Applications: Mail or deliver completed application within 21 days of the date on the application or by 30 days before Election Day, whichever is earlier. Print VRD01 in "Agency Code" box on EACH APPLICATION filled out during a voter registration drive.

- If all applicants live in the same county, then the applications can be delivered to the county clerk. If applicants live in different counties, the applications can be delivered to the Secretary of State.
- The federal voter registration application can be mailed to the following address: Secretary of State, Voter Services, P.O. Box 8111, Little Rock, AR 72203-8111.
