



Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Vermont

Voter Registration Deadline

Applications must be received by the Wednesday before Election Day.
Qualified voters can register to vote in Vermont on any day up to and including Election Day.

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Vermont does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Vermont does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

Compensation Restrictions: Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: Download and print the form from the [Secretary of State's website](#). Call 1-800-439-VOTE or email voterreg@sec.state.vt.us to order voter registration forms, or contact your local town clerk. There is no limit under Vermont law on the number of forms that may be obtained.

Federal Form: The [federal mail-in voter registration application](#) may be used in voter registration drives.

Photocopying Blank Forms: Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives.

Handling Applications

Incomplete Applications: Do not fill in any missing information on a registration form unless you have permission from the applicant.

Photocopying Completed Applications: There is no law or rule prohibiting photocopying or retaining information from completed registration applications. **A voter's date of birth, signature, full or partial Social Security Number, and driver's license number should be removed before copying any application.**

Submitting Completed Applications: Deliver completed applications in-person or by mail to the voters' [town clerk](#) by Election Day.
